

Agathoklis Azelis, Curriculum Vitae

Agathoklis Azelis is a teacher in humanities and serves as counselor in education.

He was born in 1963 in Milia Metsovou. He initially studied humanities at the University of Athens. In addition, he attended post graduate studies at the Institutes of Modern Greek and Byzantine Studies and Eastern and Southeastern European Research at the Faculty of Philosophy of the University of Vienna, and was awarded the PhD degree. For his post graduate studies, he was supported by scholarships. In 2023, he started post graduate studies in Creative Writing at the Hellenic Open University.

He worked as a researcher at the Austrian Academy of Sciences, as a Lecturer at the University of Vienna, where he taught Greek language, literature and the history of ideas, as a teacher of Greek language and literature at the "Vienna International School" and as a teacher in the course of history at the University of Thessaly. Since 1997 he has been teaching in Secondary Education in Greece as a teacher in humanities, while during the years 1999-2003 he organized the General Archives of the State-Archives of the Prefecture of Trikala, being head of the service. He was placed with repeated judgment in the position of principal at the Music School of Trikala (2011-2015), served in the same school as vice principal (2015-2017) and at the 7th General High School of Trikala as principal (2017-2023).

He is co-writer of numerous extracurricular educational books in the courses of History and Modern Greek Language and Literature. He produced translations from the German language of literary works and scientific treatises. For his literary translations he was awarded by the Austrian state with a prize in 1994.

He has participated with announcements in Greek and international conferences with scientific or educational content and in the scientific committee of Greek educational conferences, published studies in Greek and Austrian scientific yearbooks and collective projects, in Greek and German. He was a member of the "1. Wiener Lesetheater" under the direction of Ilse Aschner. He collaborated with Greek literary magazines publishing literary texts, translations and book reviews and published three poetry books and one of flash fiction.

He holds degrees in German (level C2), English (level B2) and French (level B2), while at the University of Vienna he attended courses in Romanian and Serbo-Croatian.
